



Message from the Federation Principal

We've had a lovely start to the school year with new children in **reception** and **Year 7** settling in really well and we've welcomed a number of excellent new staff to our teams.

I've really enjoyed and appreciated working with **Mrs Edwards** and **Mrs Levesley** in their new roles as **Heads of School** and the additional capacity they bring, along with the appointment of new senior leaders **Mr Dawson** in primary and **Mr Stevens** in secondary has been very noticeable. We have some important and exciting developments to be getting on with and the right team in place to achieve everything we are planning.

This is the term when we welcome families on day-time tours and to our **Open Evening** for prospective Year 7 pupils and **Open Events** for reception children in 2024. Along with other colleagues I've taken great pride in showing families around the school during the day. Open Evening is always extremely busy and it's important to remind our own Year 6 families that, although their place in Year 7 is guaranteed with us, they must make an application stating that CNS is their first choice in order not to be disappointed later as some families unfortunately were last year. We easily filled our 150 places with first-choice applicants and so a child who changes his or her mind after transfer day in July will inevitably find that all places in Year 7 have been allocated.

This term we have also been out and about visiting other local schools exploring the potential advantages to our pupils of being part of a multi-academy trust. The governing body will be hearing from three potential local trusts at an event later in October and, if a decision is made to proceed further along the road of joining a trust with a preferred partner then a community consultation will be launched in the second half of this term. More information to follow.

One of the education-related stories in the news recently has been the possible presence of RAAC or reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete in schools. We have worked hard with teams of structural engineers across our sites and our Estates Manager Mr Hambley is happy to report that there appears to be no RAAC present in any of our school buildings according to the surveys completed so far.

As the half-term holiday comes into view I wish all of our families a very happy holiday. I shall be in Nice with two colleagues and 24 of our older pupils on a language course and visit. This may not be so restful but hopefully should provide the last glimpse of sun before the Autumn sets in. With thanks as always for your support.

A group of pupils visited the Peak District to complete their Silver Award. Some pupils were in the qualifying group and the others were practising for the qualifying which will take place later in the year.

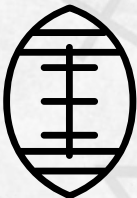


Sports

School Street

The School Street pilot around Castle Newnham primary is the fourth for the town, and means during drop off and pick up times during the school term – 8.15am to 9am and 3pm to 3.45pm – motor vehicles will not be allowed in York Street between Rosamond Road and Denmark Street. Kat Edwards, Castle Newnham Head of School - Primary said: “As a school in the heart of our community, we have always been proud of the number of children who already walk, scoot and cycle to school. The new School Street now makes it safer and more pleasant for both children and their parents on the journey to school, so we hope this encourages even more families to travel to school actively where possible.”

Line up

To start the secondary school day together (teachers, support staff and pupils) we have introduced line up, this has ensured that pupils are ready to learn and be prepared for the school day ahead. Line up is where all CORE groups stand in the playground in single file and are greeted by their Head of Year and CORE tutors, as well as senior leaders. Pupils have welcomed this new approach to the start to the day.

At our latest Secondary Open Evening the Hospitality and Catering department decided to give focus to this and created, baked and cooked a variety of small treats for our families, staff and pupils





Reward Store
